**Ahoj Members – International Yachting Fellowship of Rotarians**

Last week our guest speakers were Richard Hardman, who is the NSW Commodore of the International Yachting Fellowship of Rotarians (IYFR), and Robert Eaglesham, the Australian Commodore, introduced by George Scott.

The IYFR has been established in Australia for 51 years and has 10 squadrons throughout NSW, QLD, VIC, SA and WA. Internationally there are almost 100 fleets throughout 22 countries with approx. 3,000 members in total. It all started in 1947 and Great Britain and the IYFR is recognised as the oldest of the Rotary Fellowships. They have their own newsletter called Rotafloat and a great uniform to boot! All Rotarians are eligible to join and you don't even need to own a boat, just have a passion for boating. There are 3 main principles we are told, these being FUN FUN FUN! Being a part of IYFR allows members to enjoy the fellowship Rotary provides without the constraints of fundraising. Richard and Roberts squadron organises cruises up the Nepean River and their main activity for the year is the Australia Day function on Sydney harbour.

It sounds like great fun and a topic close to our clubs heart as we meet every week in the Yacht Club overlooking the beautiful Lake Burley Griffin. There are no squadrons south of Sydney so perhaps it is something for us to think about. To form a squadron you need 4 or 5 people and to appoint a "Port Officer".

MUNA is a great project which develops clubs involvement with local schools, builds international understanding and gives students the opportunity to expand their knowledge of the workings of the United Nations and the countries that are represented there.
