Graeme and his family decided to start a vineyard from scratch putting in power, trellises, vines, infrastructure etc. Originally working on weekends and commuting from Canberra, the weekend turned into long weekends and then they decided to move out there. It is a 50 acre property and there are approx. 20 acres of grapes.

Riesling, shiraz and cabernet sauvignon were planted.

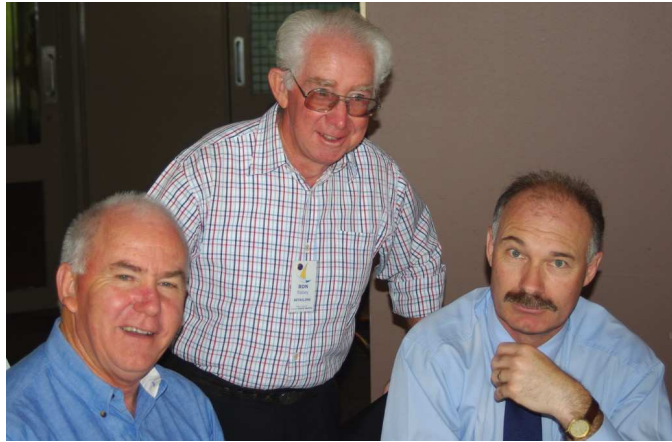

Graeme's aim is to get the grapes into bottles as quickly and easily as possible. The vineyard is irrigated with bore water. We also enjoyed some great photos of the property.
